

Show Me Your Glory
August 11 | Weekly Devotionals

Introduction:

Welcome to this study of the Old Testament where we are exploring the nature and character of God. Our foundation passage for this series is Exodus 34:6-7: "And he passed in front of Moses, proclaiming, 'The Lord, the Lord, the compassionate and gracious God, slow to anger, abounding in love and faithfulness, maintaining love to thousands, and forgiving wickedness, rebellion and sin. Yet he does not leave the guilty unpunished...'"

Our hope with this series is that you come to grow in the grace and knowledge of the one true God. To accomplish this, each week you'll be prompted to work on memorizing Exodus 34:6-7, reading Scripture passages that correspond to that week's highlighted characteristic of God, answering a couple reflection questions, and praying.

Let's dive in!

Memorize Exodus 34:6-7.

Take a few moments to continue committing Exodus 34:6-7 to memory.

Read Scripture.

For your Scripture reading, you can either do this in one large chunk or in smaller segments. The passage this week is on the people of Israel and we're looking at how God is both just and forgiving. In one sitting or spread out into smaller segments throughout your week, read through the whole book of Zephaniah.

Reflection Questions:

- How did you see God's justice and forgiveness come out in this Scripture? Why are both of these attributes important?
- In what ways have God's justice and forgiveness manifested in your own life? How have these affected how you love God and love others?

Pray:

Pray to God in response to both the Scripture and reflection you spent time with.
